### **LPC seeking feedback on Dampier Bay Design Guide**

As part of the Lyttelton Port Recovery Plan, LPC has prepared a 'Design Guide' to set out the look and feel of land development in Dampier Bay in Lyttelton and is now seeking public feedback.

"We have made a start based on what the community told us during the Recovery Plan process," said LPC Chief Executive Peter Davie. "We are now seeking public feedback on our ideas and would like to hear the community's further thoughts on the project.

The public are invited to see the Design Guide, discuss it and give feedback to LPC's design team and the Managers involved in the project at 'Port Talk', the Company's information centre on the corner of London and Oxfords streets in Lyttelton, this Saturday (30 April) between 10.30am and 1pm.

The Design Guide is being prepared in collaboration with the Christchurch City Council, the Lyttelton community and Te Hapū o Ngāti Wheke.

"Our vision is to regenerate Dampier Bay as an attractive community destination which expresses the natural history and ecology of the area and acknowledged its maritime and industrial character. We want to create an engaging and vibrant waterfront with public access and connectivity between Lyttelton and the Inner Harbour which compliments Lyttelton."

The design guide does not include the redevelopment of the marina in Dampier Bay. That will be available later this year.
