Contractor and Port User Update

Authority to Work and Permit Process at LPC

LPC is committed to providing a safe work environment and to deliver on this, we need to be aware of all work being undertaken at LPC sites. This allows us to understand the potential impact on LPC and Port User activity so we can appropriately coordinate and share risk information.

To standardise current permit processes and to allow LPC to provide a suitable work environment for all Port workers, LPC plans to implement a new and coordinated Authority to Work and Permit Process from July 1 2021. The new process will apply to all LPC and Port User groups operating in LPC sites.

LPC will be talking with those who will be expected to obtain, review or approve Work Authorities and Work Permits to discuss how best to work with existing processes to minimise the impact of the changes on the smooth running of LPC and Port User activity.

Further information with instructions to support the smooth introduction of the new process will be sent out in the coming weeks.

The purpose:

This new process will ensure all work has been appropriately scoped, risk assessed and planned to minimise impact and risk to LPC activity and infrastructure, LPC reputation and the activity of other Port Users.

Importantly, the process will ensure a streamlined approach to risk management across all work undertaken at LPC.
