

# Environmental Policy

**Lyttelton Port Company (LPC) is the largest port in the South Island of New Zealand. Our purpose is to facilitate the sustainable growth of trade for Christchurch/Ōtautahi and wider Canterbury region.** Our long-term vision is to be New Zealand's leading port. This includes being recognised as excelling in kaitiakitanga (responsible guardianship) of our environment. This environmental policy reflects the areas of environmental focus we believe are essential for our business to prioritise, to go beyond protection to enhance the environments in which we operate, for the good of our staff, communities and future generations.

## Our environmental policy commits us to:

### Comply

- Implement and maintain an environmental management system (EMS) to meet the standard set by ISO14001:2015 as a tool for continual improvement.
- Operate in a manner that exceeds applicable legislation and regulations.
- Establish environmental objectives and targets to reduce LPC's environmental impact and monitor and report our performance.
- Require third parties working on our sites to have appropriate environmental management systems in place and audit and verify these systems.

### Support and awareness

- Support our staff to achieve the commitments laid out in this policy by building knowledge, experience and skills and supplying the resources to pro-actively manage environmental risks, implement the EMS and this policy.

### Kaitiakitanga

- Play our part to address climate change by having detailed plans to support a transition to net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.
- Recognise the role and responsibilities of mana whenua and work in partnership to protect Whakaraupō/Lyttelton Harbour mahinga kai values.
- Be a good neighbor by effectively managing impacts of port operations including noise, dust, light and odour on local communities.
- Prevent pollution, ensure a high standard of stormwater discharge quality from our sites so everyone can swim, fish and enjoy Whakaraupō/Lyttelton Harbour.
- Protect the natural ecological values of land and sea where we operate and work to enhance biodiversity of our sites and the broader environment through our Biodiversity Positive strategy.
- Apply the waste hierarchy aiming to avoid waste, increase diversion from landfill and achieve zero-waste to landfill by 2040.
- Implement a sustainable procurement approach, seeking to positively influence in our supply chain and taking account of the economic, environmental, and social implications of our sourcing.

This Policy applies to all sites where LPC has operational control and applies to LPC's Board of Directors, Management and Staff and all other persons conducting business on LPC sites. This Policy will be reviewed every two years.
